Earn your Penn State Master of Social Work — Online

Penn State's 60-credit Master of Social Work (MSW), offered online through Penn State World Campus, can prepare you for a career as a clinical social worker with the values, knowledge, and skills to serve the needs of our diverse society.

As a student in the program, you can learn to:

- > effectively engage, evaluate, and intervene on behalf of individuals, families, groups, communities, and organizations
- > address growing societal needs related to children and families or mental health and substance use

- > study models and practice skills covering the lifespan, including trauma-informed therapy, cognitive behavioral therapy, play therapy, family and group therapy, holistic therapy, and telehealth/digital practice
- > combine progressive clinical computer simulations and instructional techniques with applied field experiences in realworld settings
- > demonstrate mastery of the knowledge, skills, ethics, and values necessary for clinical social work practice

Curriculum

Penn State's MSW course work examines social work across the lifespan and emphasizes cultural competence in effectively working with diverse populations across varying geographic settings.

The curriculum is divided into two levels — generalist and advanced. The required generalist curriculum includes knowledge, values, processes, and skills essential for the practice of social work. It includes social work methods, human development theory, social policy, and research methods. This foundation of knowledge is built upon by the advanced curriculum found in both the Children and Families specialization and the Mental Health and Substance Use specialization.

You will also be required to complete 12 credits of field education practicum courses.

The Penn State Master of Social Work program is currently in pre-candidacy for accreditation by the Council on Social Work Education (CSWE) Board of Accreditation (BOA).

Penn State's program is a clinically focused Master of Social Work (MSW) degree grounded in social work ethics and values of diversity, equity, and the pursuit of social justice. As a student in the program, you will choose to specialize in Mental Health and Substance Use or Children and Families.

Begin Your Application Today

To be considered for admission, prospective students should submit an online application form and a complete application portfolio. Admissions decisions for the Master of Social Work are based on a review of your complete application portfolio and the quality of your credentials relative to those of other applicants.

Your master's degree application portfolio must include:

- application form (completed and submitted online)
- copy of official transcripts from each undergraduate and graduate institution attended
- > TOEFL or IELTS score, if applicable
- references
- > résumé or curriculum vitae (CV)
- > goal statement

GRE/GMAT test scores are not required.
